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INTRODUCTION

This document is intended to establish a clear and structured guide for the Missions Ministry of Puerta del Cielo Church in the year 2025. The vision and mission described here are a reflection of our church's commitment to extend the love of Christ, both in our local community and globally. Growth in People and Funds:

Why: Empowering every church member to participate in missions fosters a Kingdom-minded culture, encouraging both donation of time and resources.

How: Conduct fundraising activities and training sessions to engage members in supporting mission projects at both the district and council levels and internationally.

COLLABORATION WITH IPAO AND DISTRICT 3 (COUNCIL)

As part of Alpha and Omega Pentecostal Churches (IPAO), our church, Puerta del Cielo Church, is located within District 3, a network that encompasses key churches in our region. The District Presbyter, Pastor Luis, is also our pastor. IPAO is organized into five districts, each dedicated to strengthening the outreach of the Gospel and fostering unity among congregations. PLANTING A CHURCH IN ALBANIA:

Iglesia Puerta del Cielo has the opportunity to take the lead in a church planting project in Albania, the country that IPAO District 3 has adopted as its primary missionary focus. This project represents a significant step in extending the Kingdom of God to a nation in great spiritual need. We will work in collaboration with the other churches in the district, leading efforts in planning, missionary training, resource mobilization, and field visits.

We will maintain a flexible approach throughout the year, adapting to emerging needs and allowing this effort to reflect Jesus' call to be a light unto the nations. We are confident that as we take this lead, we will bring lasting impact for the glory of God.

STRATEGIES FOR COMMUNICATING MISSIONARY EFFORTS TO OUR CHURCH

Communicating missionary efforts effectively is essential to keeping our church connected, inspired, and committed to God's work. STRATEGIES FOR COMMUNICATING MISSIONARY EFFORTS TO OUR CHURCH (P2)

Social Media and Digital Communications:

Social Media: We have created social media accounts for our mission ministry: on Instagram you can find us as @ipdcmissions and on Facebook search for IPDC Missions. These platforms help us share updates and connect our congregation with our mission work.

Weekly Posts: We will share brief updates on our social media channels, including photos and testimonials.

E-Newsletters: Our church currently sends out weekly newsletters via social media and internal chats. We may use these newsletters to include articles or information related to our ministry.

"ADOPT A FAMILY" PROJECT

"Imagine if **50 people from our church decided to donate \$50 a month** to a missionary project. This would generate **\$2,500 a month** to support a pastoral family, providing them with what they need to cover expenses such as food, housing, education for their children and ministry resources."

The Adopt a Family Project is an initiative designed to connect our congregation with the specific needs of pastoral families on the mission field. Inspired by the desire to be a tangible support for those who have dedicated their lives to serving God, this project seeks to engage every member of our church, allowing them to participate in missionary work in a meaningful and personal way.

1. Strategy:

- **Monthly Support:**
 - Every donation, no matter how small, has the potential to make a big impact when we all participate.
- **Direct Connection:**
 - Our church members will have the opportunity to symbolically adopt a specific pastoral family, receiving regular updates about their ministry, challenges, and accomplishments. This not only fosters an emotional connection, but also creates a deeper commitment.

Expected Impact:

Strengthening Missionary Families:

- By receiving consistent financial support, pastoral families will be able to focus fully on their ministry, knowing that they have a network of support behind them.

Spiritual Growth of the Congregation and Testimony of Unity:

- This project not only benefits missionary families, but also edifies our church by helping us to practically live out our faith and call to generosity.
- The collaboration of the entire church in this project will be a visible testimony of Christian unity and love, reflecting God's heart for the care of His people.

SHORT AND LONG TERM GOALS

This page is designed to present in a clear and structured way the long-term goals of our church's missionary ministry. These goals reflect our commitment to local and international missionary work, ensuring that every step we take is focused on glorifying God and extending His Kingdom.

1. Support for the Children's Ministry in El Salvador (SHORT TERM)

Vision: To strengthen the children's ministry led by Brother Jorge Herrera in El Salvador, ensuring that children receive spiritual, educational and nutritional support.

Strategies:

Involving Youth and Young Adults: The youth of our church will be a key part of this program, organizing activities such as:

- School supplies drives.
- Financial support for breakfasts offered to children.

Child "Adoption" Program: We will encourage the youth of our church to symbolically adopt a child and give a quarterly offering to cover essential needs such as food, clothing, and education.

Expected Impact:

- Improving the quality of life of children in El Salvador.
- Inspire our youth to be an active part of missionary work.

2. Church Planting in Albania (LONG TERM)

Vision: To prepare District 3 to plant a church in Albania, ensuring it is equipped to sustain ministry and be a spiritual beacon in the region.

Strategies:

- Preparation of Missionaries
- Financial Support
- District Collaboration:

Expected Impact:

- Establish a strong Gospel presence in Albania.
- Strengthen unity and collaboration among the churches of District 3.

SHORT AND LONG TERM GOALS

3. Work in Nicaragua (SHORT AND LONG TERM)

Vision: To expand our impact in Nicaragua by collaborating with the current council, the Parada Family, which supports the efforts of local churches, and the Galeano Family, which runs an orphanage for children in the region. This joint effort seeks to address both the spiritual and material needs of the communities, with a special focus on the churches and children.

Strategies:

Support for Local Churches with the Parada Family (Enoc Parada):

- Continue working with the Parada Family to assist the 24-27 churches in Nicaragua.
- Organize missionary visits to strengthen the bond between our church and local congregations, participating in evangelistic activities and community projects.

Support for the Galeano Family Orphanage:

- Provide essential resources such as food, clothing, and educational materials for the children of the orphanage.
- Promote the “Adopt a Child” campaign, where members of our church can commit to giving a quarterly offering to support the needs of the orphanage.

Expected Impact:

- Strengthen local churches and their capacity to serve their communities.
- Build deeper relationships between our church and communities in Nicaragua.

CONCLUSION: INTERNATIONAL MISSIONS

Our vision for international missions is deeply rooted in Jesus' mandate to "go and make disciples of all nations" (Matthew 28:19). EVANGELIZATION AND LOCAL DISCIPLESHIP

Our church's commitment to local evangelism and discipleship springs from our obedience to the Great Commission, where Jesus commands us to "Go and make disciples of all nations" (Matthew 28:19). This mandate not only drives us to work in international missions, but also to extend the Gospel message to our immediate community. This approach allows us to reflect the love of Christ as we guide others in their spiritual walk, helping them grow in faith and in relationship with God.

Biblical Basis:

Evangelism and discipleship are at the heart of Jesus' ministry and calling to His church:

- **Evangelization:** "For the Son of Man came to seek and to save that which was lost" (Luke 19:10). This passage reminds us that every effort to reach out to others must be motivated by the desire to bring them into a personal encounter with Christ.
- **Discipleship:** "The things which you have heard from me in the presence of many witnesses entrust to faithful men who will be able to teach others also" (2 Timothy 2:2). Teaching and mentoring are essential to forming disciples who will also disciple others.

Strategies for Local Evangelization:

Strategies for Local Discipleship:

MEASURING IMPACT AND FUTURE EXPANSION

The success of our Local Outreach initiatives is not only measured by the resources distributed or the activities carried out, but also by the transformative impact on people's lives and our community. Measuring Impact and Future Expansion is critical to assessing the effectiveness of our programs, identifying areas for improvement, and planning strategies for broader and more significant outreach in the future.

Methodology for Measuring Impact:

- **Participant Surveys:**

- Implement short surveys at the end of each event or program to collect direct feedback from beneficiaries.
- Key questions:
 - In what ways was this program helpful to you or your family?
 - What could we improve?
 - What other resources or services would you like to receive?

- **Volunteer Reports:**

- Ask volunteers to report their observations and experiences regarding perceived needs, community interactions, and opportunities for improvement.

- **Quantitative Indicators:**

- Number of people served in each program or event.
- Amount of food, clothing or other resources distributed.
- Participation and assistance in community and evangelization activities.

- **Stories of Transformation:**

- Collect testimonials from people who have been positively impacted by the programs. These stories not only demonstrate the impact, but also inspire others to get involved.

 - Design educational and promotional material for internal activities.
 - Explore options for customizing materials such as t-shirts, bags, and other items that represent the church's identity at local events.
- **Modify Missionary Services**
 - Inform the congregation about the actions that the church and/or council are taking to help in the specific country or area.
 - Include more local preachers, such as council pastors or preachers from our church, and continue to include guest preachers on a pre-scheduled basis.
